Dinner Special - Fireside chat with Paul Farmer and Tim Stonor

Mr Paul Farmer served as CEO of the American Planning Association (APA) and its professional institute, the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP), 2001-2014. He received academic and professional degrees from Rice University and Cornell University. His awards include a Progressive Architecture Award for Design Excellence, a National Endowment for the Arts Research Award, the Dale Prize for Excellence in Urban and Regional Planning, and the NYU-Poly Spirit of Innovation Award. He is no stranger to SIP and is currently working actively with SIP on the accreditation programme for our planners.

Professor Tim Stonor is the Managing Director of Space Syntax, an urban planning and design company - originally created at the Bartlett, University College London in 1989 - with a mission to develop, apply and disseminate a science-based and human-focused approach to architectural design. He is recognised internationally for his work in the development of data-driven design techniques, and their use in urban planning and architectural design projects from city master plans to individual building interiors.
